Generation No. 1

1. JOHANN CASPER³ KLUGH (*CASPER² KLUGE, PETER¹*) was born 1699 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany. He married (1) ANNA DORTHEA HEYLAND January 1719/20 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany. She was born Abt. July 1696 in Germany, and died March 1729/30 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany. He married (2) MARIA CHRISTIANA GROSE November 21, 1720 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany. She was born 1698 in Saxony, Germany, and died in Pegau, Saxony, Germany.

Notes for JOHANN CASPER KLUGH:

Johann is known from his January 20, 1720 marriage record and the baptismal record of his son, Carl at the Lutheran Church in Pegau, Saxony. See Book V, page 136. Johann was a white baker.

Notes for ANNA DORTHEA HEYLAND:

Anna's name is known from the baptismal record of her Son Carl./ Her death is recorded in Death Book III in 1729. She was 31 years less 4 months of age at the time of her death.

Notes for MARIA CHRISTIANA GROSE:

Maria was the middle daughter of white baker Johann Grose of Pegau, Saxony. Her marriage is recorded at the Lutheran Church in Pegau. She is also known from the baptismal records of her children.

Notes for CASPAR KLUGE:

Caspar's birth is recorded in the records of the Lutheran Church in Pegau, Saxony in page 416 of Baptismal Book V. He was christened on September 29, 1720. His godparents were Master Zacharias, the Great, the white baker; Master Christoph Eberhardt, the tailor; Ms. Christiana Maria, Master Aegidii Grosens, white bakers wife, all of whom were from Pegau.

Notes for ROSINA DOROTHEA KLUGE:

Rosina was baptized on September 02, 1726 according to the entries in page 7 of Baptismal Book VI at the Lutheran Church in Pegau. Her godparents were Carl Christian Laking, baker; Catherina Johann Gresens, the white bakers wife; Anna Sabina, Johann Andreas Gropens, the cabbage grocers wife, from Leipzig.

3. iv. CARL KLUGH, b. February 05, 1727/28, Pegau, near Leipzig, Saxony, Germany; d. October 02, 1782, Lancaster, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for CHRISTIAN GOTTLÖB KLUGE:

Christian's birth on August 03 and August 05, 1731 baptism are recorded on page 65 of Baptismal Book VI

at the Lutheran Church at Pegau, Saxony. His godparents were Christian Gottfried Spiesbach, citizen and Posamentierer; Gottlob Andreae, citizen and white tanner; Maiden Maria Rosina, Johann Grosens, the white baker's eldest daughter, all of whom were from Pegau.

vi. JOHANN CHRISTIAN KLUGE, b. May 17, 1733, Eula, Saxony, Germany.

Notes for JOHANN CHRISTIAN KLUGE:

Johann was born on May 17 and christened on May 19, 1733 according to the entries on page 91 of the Lutheran Church Baptismal Book Vi. in Pegau, Saxony. His godparents were Johann Christian Mutter, citizen and tailor; Johann Munch, citizen and hat maker, Christiana, wife of Gottfried Werner, citizen and furrier, all of whom were from Pegau.

4. vii. PHILIP KLUGH, SR., CAPTAIN, b. Abt. 1735, Pegau, Saxony, Germany; d. Aft. 1810, Maytown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

2. JOHANN GOTTFRIED⁴ KLUGE (*JOHANN CASPER³ KLUGH, CASPER² KLUGE, PETER¹*) was born January 03, 1761 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany, and died November 23, 1825 in Millersville, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He married ANNA MARIA BRUBECK December 28, 1781 in Lancaster, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. She was born January 03, 1761 in Saxony, Germany, and died Bef. November 1825 in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for JOHANN GOTTFRIED KLUGE:

Johann's baptism on August 05, 1722 was recorded on page 442 of Baptismal Book V at the Lutheran Church in Pegau, Saxony. His godparents were Heinrich Gottfried Muthmann, businessman and merchant; Gottfried Heinrich, butcher; Anna Sophia, Thomas Christian Rauschens, the cloth merchants wife, all of whom were from Pegau.

3. CARL⁴ KLUGH (*JOHANN CASPER³, CASPER² KLUGE, PETER¹*) was born February 05, 1727/28 in Pegau, near Leipzig, Saxony, Germany, and died October 02, 1782 in Lancaster, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He married SUSANNAH MARGARETA HOHN March 17, 1756 in Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. She was born June 25, 1726 in Strassburg, Germany, and died March 08, 1786 in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for CARL KLUGH:

Carl's birth on February 05, 1728 is recorded in Baptismal Register V and page 65 of Baptismal Book VI of the Lutheran Church of Pegau, Saxony. His father, Johann Caspar Kluge was a white baker and his mother was Anna Dorothea, nee Heyland. Carl's godparents were Johann Christoph Sage, a

white baker; Michael Heynichen, a needle maker, Maria Sophia, wife of Johann Michael, a harness maker, all of whom were from Pegau.

His marriage is recorded at the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. According to the marriage record, Carl Klug was a baker from Pegau near Leipzig. He married Susannah Hohin from Strassburg on March 17, 1756 (Fritz Braun and Frederick S. Weiser, "Trauungen aus dem Kirchenbuch der Evengelical Lutheran Church of the Holy Trinity in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, 1748-1767; Trinity Lutheran Church records, Lancaster, Pennsylvania" Volume 1, 1730-1767, translated and edited by Debra D. Smith and Frederick S. Weiser (Apollo, Pennsylvania; Clossen Press, 1988, page 249. The published church registers through 1767 contain the names of six children born to this couple between August 1757 and July 1766. The church register also contains the names of the following two children born to Philipp Klug and his wife, Veronica Kistler: Johannes Klug*16.i.(-17.iv.) 1763; Philipp Klug, *11.ii.(-3.iii.) 1765 (page 208).

Carl was a baker. He lived in Lancaster City and later in Paxton Township, Lancaster County. He was an original member of the Union Fire Company, No. 1, the oldest in Lancaster, founded in 1760.

Oath of Allegiance: September 27, 1742, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. (Carl Klugge). cf.Strassburger, Ralph B., "Pennsylvania German Pioneers", volume 1, page 490; facsimile of signature, volume 2, page 583.

Tax lists, Carl (Charles), baker, Lancaster Borough, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, 1770, 1772 and 1773; Manor Township, Lancaster County, 1779; Lancaster Borough 1779; Manor Township 1773; Manor Township 1782; Lancaster Borough 1782.

A second Charles Klugh appears on the Lancaster Borough lists for 1779 and 1782 as "freeman" (i.e., an unmarried man of legal age); published in the Pennsylvania Archives, Third Series, Volume 17; Tax Lists of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Charles Klug Sr. and Charles Klug Jr. were on the tax list for Lancaster Borough, Lancaster County as of 1780.

Federal Census of 1800 and of 1810, Lancaster Borough lists Charles Klugh.

Court Order October 09, 1782, Lancaster County appointing Susannah, wife of the deceased Charles Klugh, co-executor of his estate along with his son Charles Klugh. A notation on this court order dated 12 November 1782 is a petition by Susannah Klugh, son in law Frederick Frick and her son Charles Klugh stating that they are incapable of exercising the duties of co-executors with the assistance of Frederick Frick as a co-executor.

There is a 3 December 1782 record in the Orphans Court, Lancaster County in which Christopher (Christoph) Klugh, minor son (over the age of 14) chooses Musser as his guardian. Another record of the same date indicates that Henry (Heinrich) Klugh, minor son chooses Jacob Klugh as his guardian.

Pennsylvania German Pioneers, pages 489-90 records the arrival of Carl Klugh at the Port of Philadelphia on 27 September 1752 on board the Ship, "President". Carl signed his name as, "Carl Kluge". He soon changed the spelling to Klug, then to Klugh. He changed his Christian name, also, from Carl to Charles.

The 17 March 1756 marriage was recorded in the records of the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster.

Carl's death on October 02, 1782 is recorded in the records of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. A former elder of the congregation, he died of a stroke on the left side at the age of 54 years.

Susanna's middle name, Margareta comes from the records of Trinity Lutheran Church in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. On January 04, 1773, Carl Klug and his wife Susanna Margareta sponsored the baptism of Johann Carl Nagel, the son of Christoph and his wife Margareta Nagel. See Page 43, Volume II of Trinity Lutheran records as published by Closson Press.

Susanna died on March 08, 1786 at the age of 59 and is buried at the Trinity Lutheran Cemetery in Lancaster.

She died before 1809, the date of her brother Charles' will.

Frederick is known from the estate papers of Carl Klugh.

Notes for SUSANNAH MARGARET KLUGH:

Susannah Margaret Klug's birth on November 08, 1759 and her baptism on November 11, 1759 is recorded in the records of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Her parents were recorded as Carl and Susannah and sponsors as Johannes Eppeler and his wife Sophia.

This child died 7 months and 27 days after birth on July 02, 1760

and was buried the following day. After her death, her name was recorded in the Trinity Church records as Sophia Margaret Klug, child of Carl.

Johann Gottfried Klug's parents were Carl and Susannah and sponsors were Johannes Eppeler and his wife, Sophia as recorded on page 167 of the translations of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania records and published by Closson Press.

- v. CHARLES KLUGH II, b. Abt. 1762, Lancaster, Pennsylvania; d. August 1811, Lancaster Borough, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for CHARLES KLUGH II:

Charles Klugh executed his Will on August 31, 1809 and the Will was entered for probate in Lancaster Borough, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania on April 30, 1812. The Will named his brother Christopher (Johann Christoph) who also served as Executor and his sister Sophia. See FT CD # 209, Pennsylvania Wills 1682 - 1834. See Will Book K, Vol 1, page 265, 1811.

Charles had two sons and at least three daughters. See Lancaster County Will Book K, Vol 1, page 265.) Member of Company 2, 8th Battalion Pennsylvania Militia 1782.

- vi. JOHANN CHRISTOPH KLUGH, b. February 19, 1764, Lancaster, Pennsylvania; d. Aft. 1830, Lancaster Borough, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for JOHANN CHRISTOPH KLUGH:

The birth of Johann Christoph Klug on February 19, 1764 was recorded in the records of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. His parents were noted as Carl and Susanna Klug and the sponsors were Christoph Breitenheert and his wife Dorothea. See page 198, Volume 1 of the Trinity Lutheran Church records published by Closson Press.

- vii. JOHANN HEINRICH KLUGH, b. July 18, 1766, Lancaster, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for JOHANN HEINRICH KLUGH:

The birth of Johann Heinrich Klug on July 18, 1766 was recorded in the records of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pennsylvania as was his baptism on July 20, 1766. His parents were noted as Carl and Susanna and the sponsors were Heinrich Holsel and his wife Margaret. See page 219, Volume 1 of the records of the Trinity Lutheran Church, published by the Closson Press.

4. PHILIP⁴ KLUGH, SR., CAPTAIN (*JOHANN CASPER³, CASPER² KLUGE, PETER¹*) was born Abt. 1735 in Pegau, Saxony, Germany, and died Aft. 1810 in Maytown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He married (1) VERONICA KISTLER Abt. 1762 in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, daughter of JOHANN KISTLER and VERONICA. She died Bef. 1777 in Probably Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He married (2) CHRISTIANA HINKLE Abt. 1777 in Maytown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. She was born Abt. 1755, and died in Probably Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Notes for PHILIP KLUGH, SR., CAPTAIN:

This name has been spelled Klough, Kluge, Klug, Klugh, Clough, Clug and Clugh in various records.

The 20 January 1915 application for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) by Marion Arnold, Morgantown, West Virginia and approved (#113648) by the NSDAR on February 12, 1915, reported Philip Klugh's Revolutionary War service as follows:

"The service of Philip Klugh, (variously spelled Clugh, Clug, Klug, Klough and Klugh) as Sergeant of the different companies of the 7th Battalion of the Lancaster County Militia was given in the Pennsylvania State Archives verifies the statement made by F. K. Arnold of Portland, Oregon to his namesake F.K. Arnold of Reynoldsville, Pennsylvania in 1894 in the family genealogy of the Arnold family as arraigned by John Reams (son-in-law of Peter Arnold and Susannah Klugh). He said that Peter Arnold was married to Miss Susannah Klugh, a daughter of Philip Klugh in his advanced age. Philip Klugh emigrated from Germany and served as a soldier against the French and Indians, fought under Colonel George Washington in Braddocks defeat in 1755 and afterwards as a soldier during the Revolutionary war.

Susannah Klugh Arnold was born in Maystown, Lancaster County on October 10, 1795 and died at Luthersburg, Pennsylvania on April 12, 1869 at the age of 73 years, 5 months and 19 days."

The foregoing application noted that Certificates #88074 (NSDAR National # 113648) was issued on October 04, 1911 by the NSDAR to Mrs Cora Arnold Swope and Mrs Fannie Arnold Hembold who are sisters of Samuel Paul Arnold, father of Marion Arnold. See Pennsylvania Archives, Vol VII, page 159, 180, 441, 766, 689, 718, and certified copy from the State Librarian of Pennsylvania.

Philip was from Pegau near Leipzig and appears to have arrived with his older brother Carl in 1752, although he was not listed on the passenger manifest. He was a carpenter by trade. See page 490

Pennsylvania German Pioneers (1966), for the record of Carl Klugh's arrival on board the "President" on September 27, 1752. Carl signed his name as Carl Kluge

It is assumed that Philip, Sr., was born about 1735 since military records show him to have served in the Colonial Army in 1755. DAR records indicate that he was born in Strasburg but this has not been separately confirmed. Philip served in the French and Indian Wars under then Colonel George Washington and was present at the defeat of British Coldstream Guards, Major General Braddock in 1755. This would have been the 09 July battle with the French and Indians at Fort Duquesne at the head of the Ohio River. Braddock subsequently died of his wounds on 13 July 1755. Of Braddock and his officers, only Washington was not killed or wounded despite the fact that he had been highly exposed throughout the fighting. Young Daniel Boone was a teamster supporting the forces at this battle. Philip later served as a Sergeant in the 7th Battalion of Colonel Alexander Lowery's Regiment, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania Militia during the Revolutionary War. In 1755, General Braddock was the Commander in Chief of all of His Majesty's Forces in North America.

Marion Arnold (#113648: DAR Lineage Books, Volume CXIV, page 215) traced her lineage from her father, Samuel Paul Arnold back to Philip Klugh. Her DAR membership was based on Philip Klugh's service as a Sergeant in Colonel Alexander Lowrey's Regiment, 7th Battalion, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania Militia.

Another DAR membership based on the service of Philip Klugh is listed as DAR 88073.

Information posted in FT Genealogical forum indicates that Philip had a brother by the name of Carl and that they both come to America from Prussia in 1751. Both brothers settled in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

Philip was a member of the Lutheran Church in East Donegal Township (Maytown), Lancaster County and was listed on the tax lists for this township. He was also a member of the St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Maytown, Lancaster County. It is believed that Philip died after 1807 because he was still listed on the Donegal Township Lancaster tax lists in that year.

The 1767 Lutheran Church records at Maytown, Lancaster County reflect the fact that Philip Colough (Klough) and his wife Veronica were baptized by Rev. Horsel. In 1803, Rev Ernst recorded that Philip Clough (Klough) and his wife Cristiana were served communion as well as Jacob and Henry who were sons of Philip Clough. This information was extracted from the DAR application of Fannie A. Helmbold, daughter of Samuel Arnold and Sussana Clough (Klugh). This application was based on Revolutionary War service of Philip and was approved on August 23, 1911 with National # 88073. In turn, Mrs Helmbold

Information on this family came from Klugh records at St. John's Lutheran Church, Maytown, Lutheran Theological Seminary, Gettysburg, Pa., German Society Trappe Records; Deeds from Lancaster County, Book 2K, page 120, March 26, 1794, Lancaster County Book 20, page 298, January 23, 1798. Philips role in establishing the Maytown Lutheran Church is documented in "The History of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Maytown, Lancaster County., 1765-1904" by Rev. George Groll, Wickersham Printing Company, Lancaster, Pennsylvania 1904. The children of his second marriage were all baptized in St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Page 802, of the History of York County has a biographical sketch of Samuel M. Klugh. It is believed that the name Kluge in German translates to, "smart or clever" in English.

Notes for VERONICA KISTLER:

Records disagree on the proper name for this person. Some records give her name as Vernonica but in one instance it was given as Frances. Subject's mother was Veronica Kistler (or Knistler). Her name is known from the baptismal records of St. John's Lutheran Church.

Johannes died September 08, 1764 aged 1 year, 5 months and 9 days and was buried the following day.

"In 1836, my great grandfather, Peter Arnold rode horseback out to what is now the Lincoln Highway to Pittsburgh, then on to Massillon, Ohio to see some relatives and then back to Pittsburgh and north to Fort LeBuff, near Erie. He then rode east to Luthersburg. At that time Luthersburg was a small town settled primarily by German descendents from Eastern Pennsylvania. Peter Arnold bought some farm land and then returned home. The next year, 1837, Peter Arnold took his family to Luthersburg by way of Tyrone and over the mountains through Clear field to Luthersburg. My grandfather, Samuel Arnold was then fifteen years old.

"Peter Arnold was a well educated man and in the community of Luthersburg wrote wills and other legal documents and later started a general store in Luthersburg.

"The year they arrived in Luthersburg, wheat was unobtainable so great grandfather Arnold sent his boys, including my grandfather, down to Indiana County to purchase corn. Dad was told as a boy that the family ate cornmeal all the next year but that great grandmother was such a good cook that they did not object as she varied the menu.

"Great grandmother Arnold was Suzanna Klugh, the daughter of Captain Philip Klough, a Revolutionary Army soldier from Germantown (Lancaster) Pennsylvania.

"Great grandfather Arnold taught the first school in the area and there were a number of children born, as follows: George, Fred and Manasseh Arnold, all starting banks in the surrounding towns.

"Tombstone inscription reads: Born October 24, 1795; Died April 12, 1868. A write up on his son, Manasseh that Peter was born on January 12, 1794 in York County, married Susannah Klugh about 1820 in Lancaster and died on March 21, 1869 in Luthersburg, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

A record of the 1820 marriage between Susannah Klugh and Peter Arnold indicates that Peter was born in Pennsylvania in 1794 and that Susannah was born in Pennsylvania in 1795. (See Yates 111.000, JM-1, FT CD-403)

"Peter came from York County to Clearfield County in 1837.

"Peter was a Deacon in St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church in 1843.

"Apparently Peter and Mary Ann Arnold were abolitionists, for it is recorded that they harbored runaway slaves in their home.

"Birth and death are recorded in an obituary.

"Recorded in the 1850 Federal Census for Clearfield County which lists an otherwise unrecorded child, Turner born 1844."

Katharine Arnold recorded the following notes during a conversation with Samuel P. Arnold before his death in 1951:

"Great Grandfather Peter Arnold was born in Franklin Township, Pennsylvania near Dillsburg in 1767(1794). He was a tenant farmer in York County until he migrated (in 1837) to the place that he bought in Luthersburg, Pennsylvania. Dad did not know much about his great grandfather except that he had evidence that the original Peter came to the United States in 1751. His son was George Arnold, the father of Peter Arnold, my great grandfather.

"Peter Arnold was a well educated man and in the community of Luthersburg wrote wills and other legal documents and later started a general store in Luthersburg.

"The year they arrived in Luthersburg, wheat was unobtainable and so great grandfather Arnold sent his boys, including my grandfather, down to Indiana County to purchase corn. Dad was told as a boy that the family ate cornmeal all the next year but that great grandmother was such a good cook that they did not mind as she varied the menu.

"Great grandmother Arnold was Suzanna Klugh, the daughter of Captain Philip Klough, a Revolutionary Army soldier of Germantown, Pennsylvania (Lancaster County).

"Great grandfather Arnold taught the first school in the area and there were a number of children born as follows: George Arnold, Fred Arnold and Manasseh Arnold, all starting banks in the surrounding towns."

Also Pennsylvania State Archives Vol VII, page 159, 180, 441, 766, 689, 718, and certified copy from the State Librarian of Pennsylvania. Genealogist, Minnie F.
